At first, tea was usually drunk after dinner in the evening. No one ever thought of drinking tea in the afternoon until duchess found that a cup of tea and a piece of cake at three or four o'clock stopped her getting "a sinking feeling" as she called it. She invited her friends to have this new meal with her and so, tea-time was born.
